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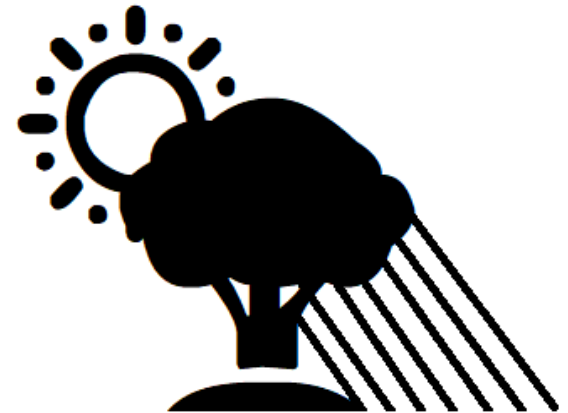
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# PLANTS FOR SHADE

# SHADE IS FULL OF POSSIBILITIES

A shady yard is not limited to trees and lawn. There are many plants with varying leaf colors, textures, heights and flowers that grow well in shade. You can create a lush, vibrant garden that will be a haven on hot, sunny days.

## Types of Shade

1. **Light Shade:** 4-6 hours of direct sun, preferably in the morning
2. **Dappled Shade:** 2-4 hours of sunlight filtered through the canopy of a tree.
3. **Open Shade:** Exposure to open sky with no direct sun. No tree canopy above.
4. **Deep Shade:** Very dense with no direct light, very little open sky.

All of the following plants do well in light shade, dappled shade and open shade. A few will tolerate deep shade, these are noted throughout the lists.

All of the following plants require moist, well drained soil. However, some of these will also tolerate dry soil and/or wet soil. These are indicated as well.

☁ = Deep shade

• = Dry soil    ∴ = Wet soil
